Cornelis was born in Rotterdam, date 10-july-1916 from Simon Philippus Hendricus van der Knaap and Theadora Hoefnagel.

After elementary school, he went to R.K.H.B.S. (Rooms Katholieke Hogere Burger School, in Rotterdam, which took 5 years.

On the 24th of june 1933 he passed exams with an average of 7+, an indication that he was more intelligent than average.

Letter: 5th of nov. 1940, by mr. J.L. van Heck, consul of the Netherlands in Angola, announcing that mr. C. van der Knaap will leave the port of Luanda, approx. 20th of nov. 1940, destination England, by s.s. 'Quanza'.

Letter: Porto, 26 december 1940, Avenida Dos Aliados, 151-2. : the dutch consul expresses surprise, but wishes him success and all the best.

Daily Mirror 14 jan. 1941 -

Lisbon - Cees van der Knaap, twenty-four, is on a 5000 mile journey to join the R.A.F. He has left his job with a dutch import and export firm in Portuguese West Africa "because I have the chance, which hundreds of my fellow countrymen envy me, to do my duty, and fight for my country." His firm has paid his fare to England and all his expenses.

This is the second time he has tried to join up.

When Holland was invaded he tried to reach the Dutch Army, in which he holds a commission.

"Holland fell, and when my brother who was in the Dutch Army wrote to me from Holland I wept like a child."

His brother wrote: "We, too, laid down our arms without firing a shot." So Cees has taken on the job for him.

After his training at the RAF in England, he is transferred in may 1942, to the Air Navigation School, no.33 in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada. He receives his license as Nav. Officer, and becomes the assignment as 1st lieutenant observer.

On the 28th of October 1943, 6 Mitchells B-25 took off for a mission to Cherbourg. The sixth airplane in the formation, FR174/K did not return to base. The returning crew reported seeing the airplane going down in flames. Pilot mr. van Dieren Bijvoet, mr. van der Knaap, Radio Op. Woesik, were burried on cemetary OrryLa Ville (Senlis). Airgunner mr. Woesik was never found (seamansgrave). *Ref.:* [3]
